one of the world's strongest economies; fueled by anti-poverty policies and exports; major sustainable development actor and international aid financier; large automotive manufacturer; app-based technology goods and services developer and exporter; global healthcare technology leader; often suffers in credit rating due to recurring aggravations from North Korea
